



## WAO2027 Singapore Team Selection

This document sets out the selection criteria for Singapore Team's participation at the 2027 World Agility Open Championships, which will be held at National Hippic Centre (KNHS) in Ermelo, The Netherlands from 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> May 2027. Judges at the event are: Pau Serrano Ciratusa, Roman Lukac and Stefanie Semkat.

To be eligible for the team, you must fulfill the residency requirements stated in the WAO rules.

Please note that the trip is self-funded i.e. you will need to pay for all expenses related to the trip including, but not limited to, travel, vet and quarantine expenses, as well as WAO entry fees, team jackets, t-shirts, fees for team manager etc.

### Summary

- (i) A total of two (2) win-on spots are available for dogs of each height class to win their way to the Pentathlon and Biathlon championship individual events – one from WAO try-outs; and one from regular shows. One (1) Games spot will be won at regular UKI shows:

- (ii) The remaining spot(s) will be offered to teams who have displayed good performances at WAO, try-outs and regular shows throughout the year.
- (iii) Team positions will be considered by the country manager based on performances at WAO, try-outs and regular shows throughout the year.
- (iv) Dogs must run in the respective WAO heights that they wish to be qualified for, at regular shows and WAO try-outs, e.g. dogs measured > 440mm and ≤ 500mm must compete at 500mm for a spot in 500 class, or compete at 600mm for a spot in 600 class. Running in select heights or other heights will not be eligible for consideration. The only exception is for dogs qualifying for 250mm class at WAO. These dogs shall jump 200mm at shows and try-outs.
- (v) Should any of the shows not run for any reason, country manager reserves the right to alter the selection process.

### Requirements

All handler and dog teams wishing to be considered for selection for Singapore team must (i) display good conduct at all shows in accordance with the WAO sportsmanship guidelines; (ii) uphold Team Singapore's code of conduct; (iii) enter at least four (4) shows<sup>1</sup> organized by Singapore Dog Agility between **January 2026** until the last show in **October 2026**; AND (iv)<sup>2</sup> to be eligible for individual events, obtain a clear round in Agility, minimum at UKI Novice level or Open level **at a show in 2026** organized by Singapore Dog Agility.



## Win-on Spots

There are two opportunities for dogs who have entered at least four (4) shows to win a spot at the WAO individual championship events:

- A) WAO try-outs – One (1) dog per height shall win its way to Pentathlon/Biathlon events
- B) Regular shows – One (1) dog per height shall win its way to Pentathlon/Biathlon/Games events

The win-on spots will be determined from the pool of dogs whose applications are received by the submission deadline on **16<sup>th</sup> October 2026**. If the same dog wins in both (A) and (B) or in the same event, the country manager will select and offer the spot to another dog at his/her own discretion based on combined results. To be eligible for the win-on spots, dogs must obtain **at least one clear round in an agility event** at Novice level or Open level at a show in 2026 organized by Singapore Dog Agility<sup>2</sup>.

### A) WAO try-outs

This offers dogs at any level the opportunity to win a spot at the individual events at WAO. Teams who wish to earn a spot via this route must participate in all the classes for that event and get a result at the try-out, i.e., not eliminated. To qualify for Biathlon, teams must run both Biathlon Jumping and Biathlon Agility. To qualify for Pentathlon, teams must run 2xPent Jumping, 2xPent Agility and Speedstakes.

WAO try-outs will be held in August 2026 (TBC). Courses at try-outs are designed by international judges, judged by themselves or by an approved UKI judge.

Scoring for the events will be as per WAO rules, unless otherwise stated. If there are no results from this try-outs, the spot will be filled at the discretion of the country manager at the end of the season.

### B) Regular shows

This is a points-based system where points will be awarded to runs at shows organized by Singapore Dog Agility. Open courses are designed by international judges, judged by themselves or by an approved UKI judge. Events offered at Open shows will be announced in due course.

The table below shows the points awarded for **clear rounds**. 2nd and 3rd placing dogs will only get points if their times are within 3 seconds from the 1st placing dog<sup>3</sup>, e.g. If the 1st placed dog clocks 30s in jumping, the 2nd and 3rd placed dogs will be awarded WAO points provided its time is less than or equal to 33s.

**For UKI events**, beginner and novice classes will be combined to determine the placings for the award of WAO points; senior and champion classes will be combined to determine the placings for the award of WAO points.

- The total of the best ten (10) results from Open Agility and Open Jumping will be used to determine the winner of the Pentathlon spot. Open Speedstakes are not included, but will be used as a tie-breaker.



- The total of the best ten (10) results from UKI Agility and UKI Jumping will be used to determine the winner of the Biathlon spot. UKI Speedstakes are not included, but will be used as a tie-breaker.
- The total of the best four (4) results from UKI Games will be used to determine the winner of the Games spot

In the event of a tie, the dog with the most number of clear rounds in Speedstakes will be the tie-breaker for Pentathlon and Biathlon events, and the dog with the higher Gamblers scores will be the tie-breaker. In the event of a further tie, the dog with the faster average speed will be used as the tie-breaker.

1. Handler's name
2. Dog's call name
3. Dates, Results and points accumulated (at least 4 shows)
4. WAO events applying

A deposit of S\$600 per dog must be made to the Singapore team management by **16<sup>th</sup> October 2026** together with the application. This money will be non-refundable if the dog is selected, and it shall be used for partial payment of Team Entry Fees, stables, team manager fees etc. The amount and deadline may be subject to change. Incomplete submissions will not be considered.

In the event spots are not taken, the country manager reserves the right to fill those spots at his/her own discretion, which may include inviting Singapore citizens based overseas (and are hence unable to compete in the try-outs and regular shows) to fill the spots.

- <sup>1</sup> Each back-to-back show on the same weekends is considered as one show, e.g., participation in 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> July events is considered as one show. If COVID or any unforeseen circumstances forces the cancellation of shows, the following contingency plans will be in force:
- If there are less than 4 shows, the requirement to enter at least 4 shows will be waived. Shows already conducted and remaining shows up to the last show in October 2026 will be used for points accumulation
  - If all the shows in 2026 cannot be held, teams are still encouraged to apply and selection will be at the discretion of the country manager and approved by WAO
